

Ready for Another Century of Battle

Contrary to local tour guides, we have been informed by Dr. Bob Booth that the Ancient City Baptist Church tower was never designed to be a bell tower, but is an example of Norman architecture. Most of us remember history well enough to know that "D-Day" in WWII was an invasion of Normandy, France, after France had come under German control. That invasion by the Allied powers was launched from England and led to the liberation of France. Farther back in history the Normans of France invaded Britain from Normandy. The term Norman architecture is used to categorize styles of Romanesque architecture developed by the Normans in the various lands under their dominion or influence in the 11th and 12th centuries. In particular the term is traditionally used for English Romanesque architecture. This Romanesque style originated in Normandy and became widespread in England. Ancient Rome's invention of the arch is the basis of all Norman architecture

Our historic Norman tower has recently been repaired after 122 years of fighting the ravages of weather in the battle against time. We were alerted by a business that specializes in repairing church steeples that our tower may have been damaged by hurricane Matthew. One of our members, R.J. Inman, came to our aid with his

Matthew. One of our members, R.J. Inman, came to our aid with his new drone which is equipped with a camera. The camera produced pictures that were enlarged to

approximately life sized close-ups of damaged shingles. Some were the original slate shingles placed on the tower in 1895! Sure enough, we had a number of missing or damaged shingles. A specialty roofing company replaced every damaged or missing shingle. Led by Mark Hall, church administrator, a group of men including Larry Sheaffer, Bob Blake and Tony Ortiz, made other repairs while the scaffolding was in place. These included cracks in the mortar joints of the bricks and leaks around windows. They also pressure washed and painted window frames.

The history of our tower is even more interesting when we include the fact that at least one former pastor lived in the tower. The top room was also used as a Sunday School classroom when Tom Parrish, former church administrator, was a little boy. Curtis Powell's father taught his class! The Bible says, "The name of

the Lord is a strong tower; The righteous run to it and are safe." (Proverbs 18:10)


in the entrance to the church as well as in the Sunday bulletins and Friday reminders.


